

World Road Statistics

- Edited yearly since 1964 (56 years)
- Covering 208 countries, 56 indicators, 11 sections
- Data collected from primary statistical sources (Ministries, Road Authorities, National Statistical Offices)
- Definitions based on the Glossary of Transport
 Statistics (ITF/EUROSTAT/UNECE) and The World Bank
- Data used by Governments, Investment & Development Banks, Public & Private Companies, Research Institutes
 & Universities, NGOs, International Organizations, etc.



IRF Global Road Data Warehouse

Project supported by



- Multifunctional online data platform
- IRF datasets + Dashboards (by country / region)
- Capacity to integrate additional datasets from other sources.
- Expected to go live Feb 2020.



The expected benefits of the Data Warehouse

- Data will be available to countries and Regional Observatories
- More robust data validation process
- Enhanced analysis, communication and advocacy
- Better serve capacity building efforts at all levels
- Foster collaboration and coordination by providing the opportunity to integrate different datasets.







PREPARING THE WORK FORCE

- The Transportation sector employs over 10 million persons in the EU
- Big Transformation automation, electrification and greening of transport
- Facing problems in staffing its several domains with appropriate and qualified personnel.
- Need for changes in training and education content, curricula, tools and methodologies absolutely imperative

CONCRETE ACTIONS SHOW PROJECT



Horizon 2020 European Union funding for Research & Innovation



- Support the migration path towards sustainable urban transport.
- Deploy of shared, connected, cooperative, electrified fleets of autonomous vehicles in real-life urban demonstrations in 5 Mega, 6 Satellite and 3 Follower Pilots taking place in 20 cities across Europe.

1,500,000 passengers and 350,000 units of goods

74 Vehicles (L4/L5)

24 Months pilots

69 Partners

Speeds ranging from 18 to over 50km/h

Twinning actions with 11 organizations from all over the world

CONCRETE ACTIONS

IRF COMMITTEE ON CONNECTED & AUTONOMOUS MOBILITY

- Multi-stakeholder forum (private sector, government, academia, ...)
- Different work streams (Legal/policy, Technology, Socio-economic impact)
- Bring infrastructure back in to the picture
- Input to EC and UN regulatory bodies
- Collaboration with: ASECAP, ERF, TRB, IBTTA, others
- Launch date: Q1 2020
